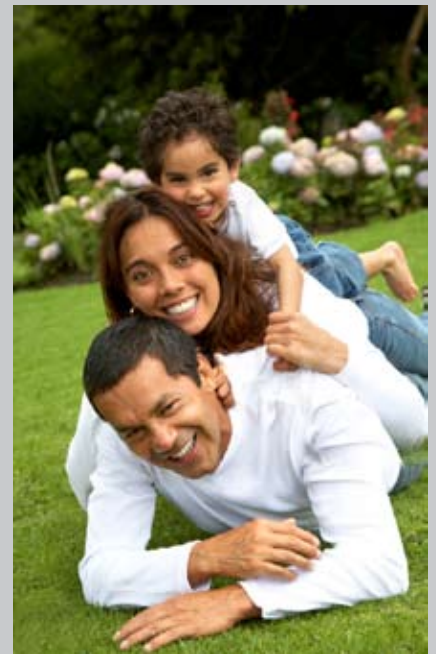

Dear Friends,

We are pleased to report that 2008 was a historical year for Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (SIHF). This past year was highlighted by unprecedented growth in scope, service, and size that reinforces our commitment of developing a fully integrated health care home for our patients and the communities we serve.

In 2008 SIHF embarked on a progressive plan to expand access to quality healthcare in Southern Illinois. During this past year we opened six new health centers (located in Alton, East St. Louis, Granite City, Greenup, Effingham, and Madison). SIHF also launched a new Mobile Health Services operation to provide access to quality healthcare for the Homeless population in St. Clair County. Collectively these new centers more than double the number of new centers ever opened in one year in our organization's history! Additionally, we added three dental chairs, and mental health counseling services at our Bethalto location, expanded the Belleville Family Health Center by adding 5 new exam rooms, and added a new primary care suite and psychiatric services to our Granite City (Koch Center) location.

In 2008, our growth was not limited to new locations; last year outpatient visits increased by 14.6%, to more than 255,000. In excess of 82,000 individuals were served at the SIHF facilities representing over an 11% increase from 2007. While we are extremely thankful for the opportunity to provide quality healthcare to our neighbors, friends, and communities, the ability to meet the needs of this demand is a direct reflection of the tireless efforts of the outstanding health care providers at SIHF and the 29 new providers that joined our organization in 2008.

SIHF remains committed to and appreciative of our partnerships. We would like to especially thank our elected officials, community leaders, local organizations, businesses, and Board Members that work with us every day as we strive to fulfill our mission of a fully integrated health care home for our patients and the communities we serve.

■ *Belleville Family Health Center Expansion*

SIHF announced the opening of a new office at the Belleville Family Health Center. This new addition opened on December 4, 2008 with funding by the State of Illinois. Due to Belleville Family Health Center exceeding 26,000 visits this year, it was important to create more access to patients in this area. The health center expanded it's services by adding a new office, Suite 201, which employs two Family Practice Providers, Ellen McDermott, MD and Alana Thompson, MD.

■ *Counseling Services*

SIHF is proud to announce new counseling services at our Granite City, Bethalto, and Alton locations. SIHF will integrate mental health services, substance abuse screenings, brief intervention, treatment, and linkage with community based services. SIHF will conduct group sessions to include several topics such



as Diabetic Education, Post Partum Depression, smoking

cessation and other relevant topics. Licensed counselors will be available to provide these services as well as Psychiatric and Nursing support.

■ *Delmar Dental Center*

On February 27, 2008 SIHF opened Delmar Dental Center in Granite City.



Delmar Dental cares for Adult and Pediatric dental patients, Monday

thru Friday. Additionally, SIHF received a grant from the Illinois Children's Healthcare Foundation to expand dental services to the children of Granite City. Due to this grant we have been able to exceed clinical indicators for the number of children reached for Dental Services. This location will allow us the opportunity to increase dental access for patients in our Granite City and Madison service areas. Services are provided by Albert Trtanj, DDS and Dr. Gary Lindsay, DMD.

■ *Effingham Health Center*

On March 3, 2008, SIHF opened its doors for patient services in Effingham, Illinois. The Effingham Health Center became a reality through a



collaborative relationship with St. Anthony's Memorial Hospital. SIHF and

St. Anthony's recognized the need for primary care services for the under served in the Effingham area. After opening this new location, SIHF was awarded a grant by the Illinois Children's Health Foundation to provide dental services to the residents of this area. SIHF will begin these dental services in 2009. Currently, this center provides primary care services through Shadi Altwal, MD and Delbert Huelskoetter, MD.

■ *Good Samaritan Health Center*

SIHF announced the opening of the Good Samaritan Health Center on July 1st, 2008, in Alton, Illinois.

The Good Samaritan Health Center was originally operated by St. Anthony's Hospital. In the spring of 2008, St. Anthony's Hospital approached SIHF with the opportunity to assume this practice. This center serves a high population of under insured and self-pay patients. This collaborative effort will enhance the primary care services in this area. Since opening in July, SIHF has experienced significant growth at this location and is already considering plans to further expand services in 2009. SIHF has been humbled by the amount of appreciation we have received from the patients, St. Anthony's Hospital, and the community since operating the Good Samaritan Health Center. This center currently employs Vincent Hidalgo, MD, a Family Practice Physician, and Lee Ann Tardino, ANP-BC.

■ *Health Center in Greenup*

SIHF opened the Greenup Health Center in February of 2008. Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation received a federal grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to provide and expand access to healthcare services for the residents of Cumberland County. This center coincides with the Federal Governments' initiative to place health centers in some of the most underserved counties in the country. Greenup, Illinois is located in eastern Illinois off of I-70, about 30 minutes from the Illinois/Indiana border. Currently, Greenup provides Family Practice services through Bashar Alzahabi, MD, Internal Medicine and Michelle Dallmier, FNP-BC.

■ *Madison Health Center*

SIHF welcomed Madison Health Center to our healthcare network in February 2008. Madison Health Center was created as part of an Illinois Community Health Center Expansion Program to



create healthcare services to the city of Madison. Mayor Hamm of Madison and Illinois' Senator James F. Clayborne Jr. were very instrumental in paving the way to develop this new center. Currently, Madison Health

Center provides Pediatric, Family Practice, and OB/GYN services to the community. Jason Kesselring, MD, Pediatrician, Jay Brieler, MD, Family Practice, and Verna Porter, MD, OB/GYN, are our primary healthcare providers. Madison Health Center is considered one of our model health centers because of its efficient layout, and design.

■ *New Public Housing Grant*

In the fall of 2008, Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation received funding from the Federal Bureau of Primary Health Care to implement a Public Housing Primary Care program (PHPC) in East St. Louis and Collinsville, Illinois. This new program provides public housing residents direct access to comprehensive primary care and links individuals and families to a medical home. The goal of PHPC is to improve overall health and well-being of public housing residents. Services provided at Public Housing Primary Care health centers include: Primary Care, Laboratory Services, Behavioral Health/Counseling, Transportation, Health Education, Community Outreach programs and a Discount Pharmaceutical Program.

FACTS

FAMILY AND CHILD TREATMENT SERVICES



Family and Child Treatment Services (FACTS) is a medical/psychological/clinical services program for children ages birth to 18 years and is located at West Belleville Health Center in Belleville, Illinois. FACTS is a collaborative effort between Children's Research Triangle, Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (SIHF), Chestnut Health Systems (CHS), and the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services. It is designed to promote stability for children and families affected by methamphetamine and other substances abuse. FACTS is funded through a five year contract from the Administration for Children and Families (ACF).

In 2008, FACTS assessed over 70 children in the Southern Illinois area ensuring they received the comprehensive and individualized services they required. In the past local families had to travel to Chicago for these types of services.

FACTS offers comprehensive medical and psychological evaluations for children ages birth to 18 with a history of prenatal substances exposure (i.e., born with a positive toxicology screen or concerns that the biological mother used substances during the pregnancy) and for children exposed to substance use in their environment. It is open to biological, foster, or adoptive children. Children may be referred for evaluations for a variety of reasons, including:

-Concerns about developmental progress of children,

-Behavioral problems at home or school such as tantrums, aggression, or oppositional behavior,

-Difficulties learning,

-Questions about mental retardation, history of abuse, neglect, or other trauma,

-Concerns about the effects of prenatal/ environmental methamphetamine, alcohol, cocaine, or other substance exposure.

In addition to psychological, medical, and developmental evaluations, FACTS also provides free individual, family, and group therapy funded through ACF as well as training for community agencies. This has been a wonderful addition to SIHF, and we look forward to many years of added impact to our communities.

Practice Based

Research Network

Southern Illinois Practice Based Research Network (SIPRO) is a collaborative approach to developing practice based research at SIHF with the Southern Illinois University School of Medicine. It is based on the belief that knowledge for improved health care delivery lay undiscovered within the clinical setting itself; it awaits discovery by those who need it most, the practicing physicians. To facilitate this discovery process, the SIU School of Medicine funds a full time Practice Research Manager to provide a supportive infrastructure in which research can be conducted. A co-learning exchange that provides research training and pairs 3 SIHF physicians with 3 faculty members to develop research of mutual interest has been initiated this year. To assure that any research is acceptable to the community, SIHF has developed a Statement of Community Values within which all research must comply. The Board members on the Research committee include, Willie B. Nelson, Sr., Lucy Smith, PhD, and Ethel Manager. Grant applications have been submitted to federal agencies and the American Academy of Family Physicians.



National Association of Community Health Centers Honors SIHF Board Chairman with Award

Willie B. Nelson, Board Chairman of Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (SIHF), was selected as the recipient of the 2008 NACHC Ethel Bond Memorial Consumer Award. Mr. Nelson received the award Sunday, September 18th, at the 2008 Community Health Care Awards of Excellence hosted by NACHC. The Ethel Bond Memorial Consumer Award is in recognition of Mr. Nelson's outstanding achievements



and contributions to the health center mission and to community-based healthcare overall. Mr. Nelson's wife, Gloria, and daughter, LaVonda, attended the award ceremony.

Willie B. Nelson has served on the Board of Directors for Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation for over 15 years and has served as the Board Chairman for the past 6 years. During his board tenure, Mr. Nelson assisted in creating access to quality healthcare services for the medically underserved in 12 communities through 30 health centers. This now provides much needed care to over 80,000 patients each year regardless of the patient's ability to pay.

"I am proud of how we have grown and developed our organization over the years. Building access to healthcare services has been a difficult task, but we have prevailed, and we continue working hard each day to create a better future," said Mr. Nelson during his acceptance speech.

Willie B. Nelson is a very active member of the East St. Louis Community. Mr. Nelson worked his way to bank manager of First Financial Bank after starting out as a custodian in 1955. After he retired in 1998, his full-time job became being active in the community. In 2001, Mr. Nelson organized the First Cancer Relay for Life Race in East St. Louis, which has grown to an annual event raising thousands of dollars for cancer patients in the community. He has played active roles in many other organizations such as the Elks, Illinois Affordable Housing Trust Fund, Chamber of Commerce, Katherine Dunham Museum, Target 2000 Metro East Associates, Friendship Baptist Church, and Greater Faith Christian Church.

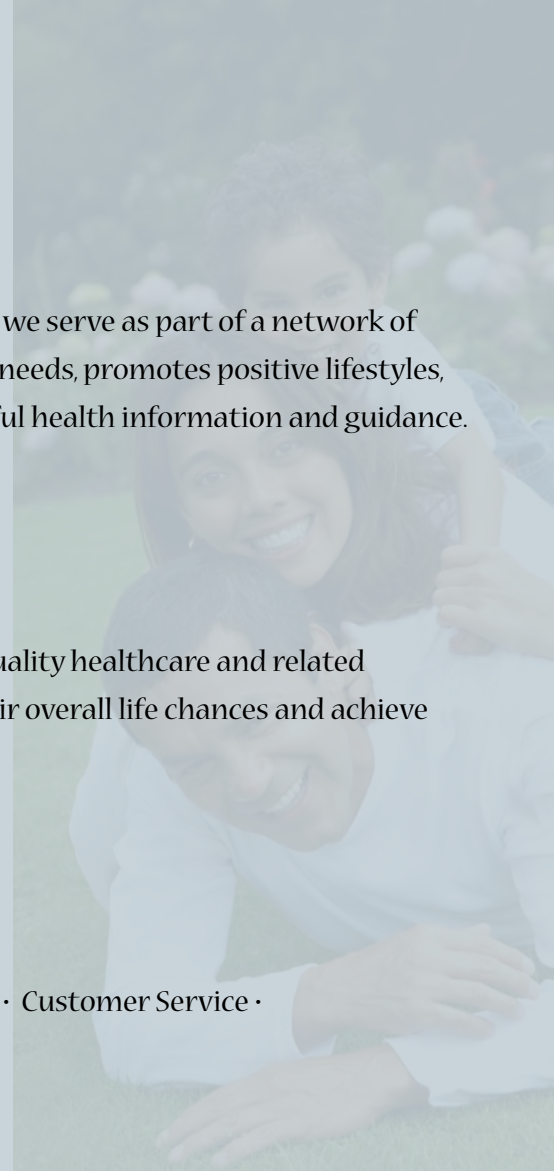

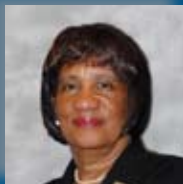

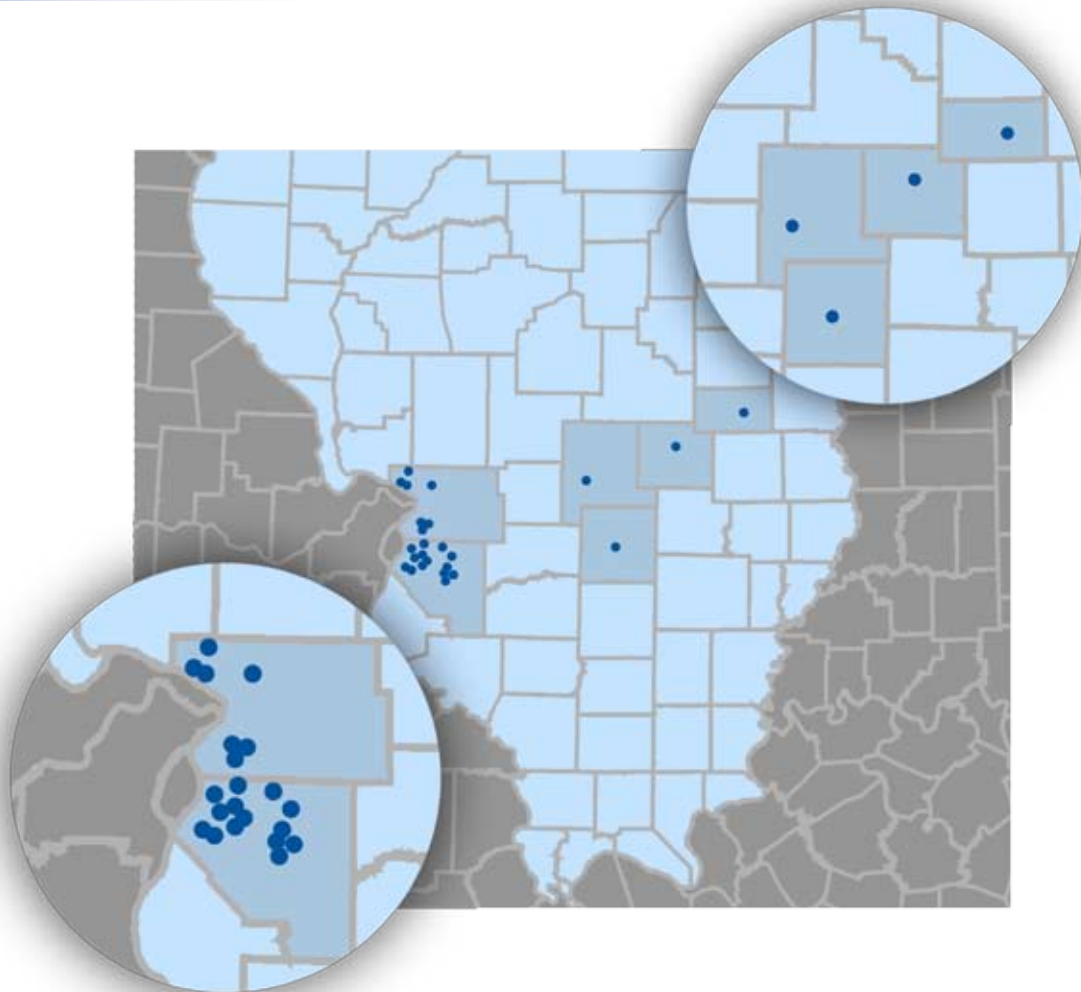
